

Knapp-Monarch "Flatwork Ironer," no. 444

The "Flatwork Ironer," Knapp-Monarch's most attention-getting iron, was designed by William E. Gundelfinger, presumably an employee. He filed a patent for the distinctive "guard rail" on the iron the year before he filed for a design patent for the iron. As the name implies, this iron is intended to iron flatwork; sheets, tablecloths and the like.
